Liturgy: Three year faith theme: Growing in the Trinity Year one: Growing in Love with the Father

In Partnership with St. Jean Baptiste Parish, Father Trini, our staff and students led the following liturgies and celebrations: Opening Celebration, Thanksgiving Celebration, Grade 4 Bible Presentations, Living Rosary, Remembrance Day Liturgy and Ceremony, Advent Reflections, Reconciliation (twice per year), Ash Wednesday Celebration, Way of the Cross led by students from END, Resurrections Celebration, Student and staff faith retreats. and a Year End Celebration.

Permeation:

The permeation of faith is realized in all subject areas and aspects of school life. Through staff and student modeling, encouragement, and guidance, students engaged in daily prayer and continued to learn about the gospel values and how to 'Grow in the Love of the Father.'

The school community developed a greater understanding of how to love one another through faith formation, prayer, mindfulness, and action. We at END will continue to celebrate, and teach the whole child; Mind, Body and Spirit!

Service:

END Students and staff serve those in need through many social justice projects including:

Terry Fox Foundation, Morinville Food Bank, K of C Christmas Gift Bags, Student clothing donations to Morinville Mid-Stream, decorating Christmas bags for the imprisoned, Jessica Martel Foundation, and fundraising to help with the rebuilding of St. Jean Baptiste Parish. Participation in Division projects with CSS refugee services and Our Lady of Kabeo Orphanage.

Percentage of teacher, parent and student agreement: students are safe at school, are learning the importance of caring for others, are learning respect for others and are treated fairly in school. 89.8%

Student Safety: We continued to focus on being safe and caring using school wide expectations taught through morning announcements, small group meetings with the school counselor and lessons taught by the GSACRD Voice. These positive behaviors are rewarded with weekly PAWS (Polite, Attentive, Welcoming and Safe) ticket draws, allowing our students to receive small rewards for all their good choices. The restorative justice model will also be used, with a focus on maintaining and developing student relationships. Intentional listening to student concerns during conflict resolution is also used to ensure that our students feel safe and heard. Our family support worker is also available to help our families in need. Increased bus traffic safety for parent drop off zones by creating another exit to allow for smoother traffic flow and a safer area to drop off and pick up students.

Inclusive Learning:

All of our students are integrated into the regular classrooms and receive the necessary support to ensure their success. Targeted intervention in literacy and numeracy are provided in small group sessions within and outside of the classrooms. Targeted supports such as IPP's, Behavior Plans, Safety Plans, NVCI, and Trauma based practices, will also be used to support students when required.

Counseling support is also available to any student that may require it.

Foundational Knowledge of First Nations, Metis and Inuit:

Through core classes, morning announcements, dedicated school days and focused activities, students and staff are learning about Truth & Reconciliation, residential schools, treaties, cultural stories and Indigenous beliefs & practices. Our staff engage in meaningful PD led by our Indigenous Committee teacher leads.

Student Engagement:
