#### **5.0** Reports

- **5.1** Trustee Report Mrs. Noreen Radford
  - Student Engagement Plan A Student Engagement Committee has been formed with the intent to enhance student voice and participation in the governance process by creating opportunities for dialogue between students and trustees. The initiative will begin with two students, nominated by school administrators, in grades 7-12 from eight schools across the division. The first meeting will serve as an introduction of trustees and a short presentation of the board's responsibilities.
  - St. Jean Baptiste Award was established to recognize and celebrate
    French immersion students in our high schools who demonstrate
    perseverance and dedication to making a meaningful contribution to the
    French Immersion spirit and culture recommendation was to add an
    additional \$500 annually to support this award
  - Faith Formation The Faith Formation Committee developed a plan to involve trustee and, as deemed appropriate, administration led faith

formation sessions at the Committee of the Whole public meetings. This would be 15-20 minutes in length with topics such as:

- a. Saint of the Day
- b. Reflection of the monthly prayer
- c. Topics of current interest in our faith
- Inclusive Education Programming Update review of the Inclusive Education Programming in GSACRD under the headings of:
  - a. Continuum of Supports and Services
  - b. School Learning Teams
  - c. Imagine Learning
  - d. Diagnostic Assessments
  - e. Individual Program Plans
  - f. Dossier
- Waivers There are lower transportation waiver amounts which may be attributed to the reduction of fees – total projected value of waivers is \$3,017 for 2024-2025
- Education Foundation The objects of the foundation, as filed with AB
   Corporate Registry in 2016, are:
  - To advance education by providing equipment and educational aids to students and schools of Greater St. Albert Roman Catholic Separate School District No.734
  - To advance education by providing publicly available scholarships, grants, awards, and other forms of financial assistance to students of Greater St. Albert Roman Catholic Separate School District No.734
  - c. To do all such things as are incidental or ancillary to the attainment of the above purposes.
  - The Foundation has provided annual support to district schools since 2019, for a total of \$40,380, through the "Futures Fund" Group Grant Program, which has benefitted 14 different schools and 19 different projects (ranging from \$4,150 to \$8,400 each year, depending on fundraising success). The Foundation has also provided \$12,250 in support to 28 different students directly through two annual grade 12 scholarships (since 2018) and up to four annual grade 9 scholarships (since 2021 delayed in 2020 due to Covid-19).
  - On October 21, 2024, the Foundation launched its fifth annual Christmas Cash 50/50 Raffle. The Foundation raised just over \$2,900 to assist in funding group grants for educational enhancements.

- This year, a total of \$8,400 in funding was provided to five schools: \$5,000 to Friends of SKT Association for an outdoor classroom structure; \$1,000 to Ecole Notre Dame for English + French decodable reading resources; \$700 each to Morinville Community High School and Georges H. Primeau Middle School for the development/enhancement of Star Spirit Lodges; and \$1,000 to Legal School for supplies for team building activities and indoor recess.
- It is through fundraising events and tax-deductible donations from district supporters that the Foundation is able to move forward with a common goal of "Building Better Futures, One Student at a Time".
